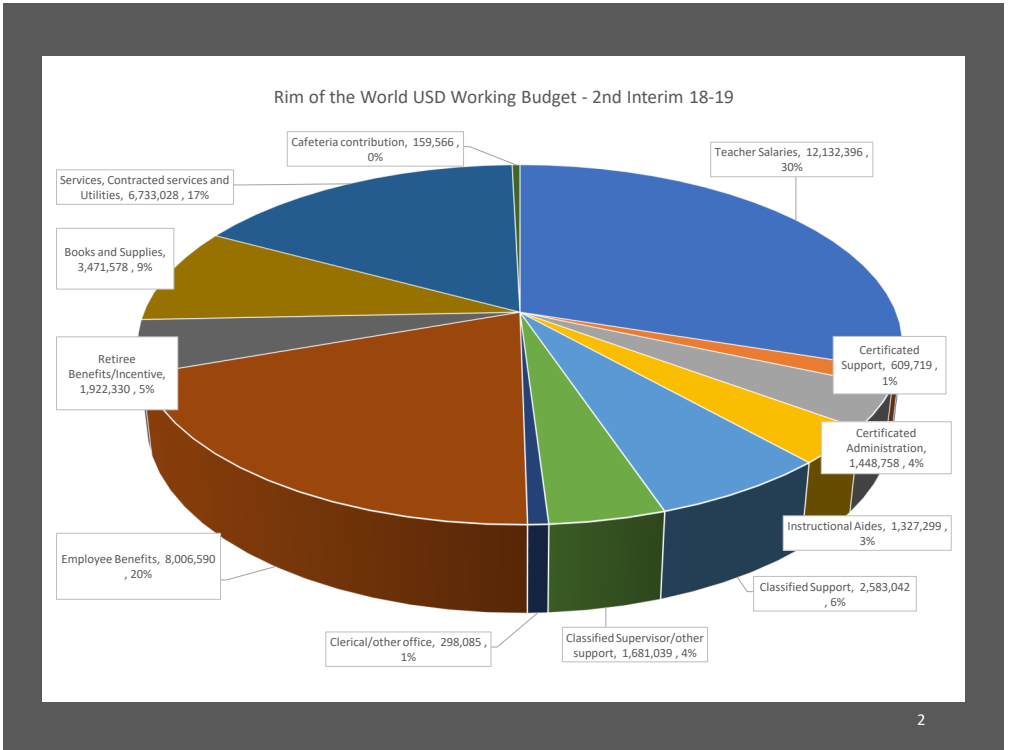

Snow Days in Calendar

Currently, there are 6 days built in our calendar for snow, which now have all been used. Staff and students will need to be at school in March and May. Our district calendar on our website has been updated for March and May to reflect the removal of all built-in snow days. For the additional day(s), the district will be applying for a waiver in March or April depending on weather. Thank you for making sure your student attends school on these built-in snow days in March and May.

Every Day Counts! Missed School days not only impacts learning, but it decreases the funds to service students. Below is the daily rate for missed school. Depending on the grade level, one day missed can equal \$54.66 per student.
