Mountain High School and the Department of Forestry have begun a partnership making Trail Head signs. As part of Mountain High's English requirement, seniors have a senior portfolio in which they need community service hours. This project allows our students to earn service hours by helping build Trail Head signs for the National Forest Service.

The Forest department provides the wood and hardware, and we enlisted Rim High School's wood shop to put the signs together. Rim High students in wood shop cut and build the signs, and Mountain High picks them up, sands and paints them here on site at Mountain High School. This 2017/2018 we have 20 signs to produce. These signs are 10 feet tall and 4 feet wide.

The Forest Service is very pleased with the finished product. Their hope is to build the program in the coming years. This is our first endeavor with such a task, and we are proud to fill a need for our community as well as for the National forest. This also provides a school to work connection for our students. Together We Can


CHE
