Elementary

Students learn that, while people can develop rewarding friendships online, they should be cautious with online-only friends and never reveal private information. Learn the difference between online and in-person friends. Lesson for K-2: Going Places Safely. Lesson for 3-5 is Talking Safely Online.

Middle School

Online talk has its benefits but students can also encounter talk that may make them uncomfortable or represent inappropriate behavior. Students will learn how to recognize and respond to risky online interactions. Lesson for 6-8 is Safe Online Talk.

High School

The terms "stranger danger" and "online predator" can be misleading. Students need to learn to recognize inappropriate contact online. Students will discuss risky online relationships and draw conclusions about how to stay safe online. Lesson for 9-12 is Risky Online Relationships.
