

ROTARY SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

Rotary Club of Lake Arrowhead scholarships can be accessed through the Association Scholarship Application. Additional requirements for these scholarships are described below. One of those requirements is an essay as described below for each type of scholarship. **Essays and the Association Scholarship Application are due in the College and Career Center by 2 p.m. Thursday, March 31, 2022.**

CITIZENSHIP SCHOLARSHIP

Rotarians apply what they call The Four-Way Test to their thoughts, actions, and communications. Applicants for Rotary Citizenship Scholarships must write an essay of approximately 250 words on how The Four-Way Test relates to your life. For example, how does the Test relate to your past or to your future goals? Relate any part of The Four-Way Test to your own life, goals, experiences, and/or beliefs.

The Four-Way Test of the things we think, say, or do:

- 1. Is it the TRUTH?**
- 2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?**
- 3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?**
- 4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?**

VOCATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP

Applicants for this scholarship must be planning a career that does not require a 4-year degree but does require more education or training such as a 2-year community college degree, a cosmetology license, IT, cooking school, etc. Essay: In approximately 100 words, tell how you might use The Four-Way Test (see above) in your planned career. For example, what business practice or attitude might follow any part of The Four-Way Test? How would you apply it to your future goals? Apply one or more of the “test” questions to your future goals or planned experiences.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is reserved for a student whose career requires a 4-year degree and who has a financial need, a **hardship, that makes paying for college even more difficult than normal**. That hardship, condition, or situation must be explained in the essay as you explain how this scholarship would help you reach your goals. In another paragraph, write about the importance of service to you now or, looking to the future, how “service” will be part of your post-college life.
