



## Rim of the World Unified School District School Sites Accomplishments 2018-2019

### **CHE:**

- Implementation of new ELA curriculum “Journeys”
- Purchase of SMARTBOARDS for every classroom with training
- Completed application for State PBIS GOLD Recognition
- Provided Saturday School once a month March- May
- Highest attendance in district year to date at month nine, above 95%
- Garden boxes on patio growing edible herbs for students and parents
- PTA beautification and inspirational message daffodil bulb planting by each student at school
- Six teachers trained in GLAD strategies with elementary collaboration of six from both LAE and VOE

### **LAE:**

- MTSS Leadership Team has created an Action Plan clearly delineating our viable and guaranteed curriculum for EACH grade-level to focus on:
  - a. Academics Tier 1, 2, & 3
  - b. PBIS “Cubbie Pride” Solid Tier 1 Implementation and beginning phases of Tier 2 implementation
- All grade-levels have created Standards Aligned Pacing Maps
- Safety Nets in place for students:
  - a. Title 1 and EL Aide push-in to grade-level teams to work with small groups of students
  - b. Universal Access (UA) Time
  - c. Kindergarten Teachers provided data-driven systematic intervention support to students in grades 1-5.
  - d. First grade “Reading Club” intervention utilizing trained volunteers in guided reading strategies.
- LAE’s STEM Lab was launched
  - a. NGSS Training
  - b. Rim Ed Grant written for all grade-level STEM Lab equipment

### **LAE (continue):**

- Safety Team has refined our needs assessment: additional walkie-talkie radios and emergency lanterns purchased to add to our emergency supplies put in place in 2017-18.
- Saturday School launch has been a success. We had on average 4 classes with a total of 65 students each month. Only positive comments from students and staff have been received.

### **VOE:**

- PTA hosted Trunk or Treat and St. Patrick's Day BINGO
- Sent 4 teachers and the principal to the Occidental Arts & Ecology Center School Garden Training
- Participated in Red Ribbon Week and The Great Kindness Challenge
- Sent 6 teachers to GLAD Training
- Hosted Family Science Night
- Developed the VOE "Ladder of Success" of academic expectations at each grade level
- PTA organized and painted the eSTEM Science Lab

### **MPH:**

- Transition to Middle School Model
- Minimum days every Thursday for professional development
- Successful PE-school record competitions in May of 2019 including 6<sup>th</sup> grade students along with the middle school model allowing for 6<sup>th</sup> grade students to participate in PE every day similar to 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students. One school record broken by Emily Lopez for Flex Arm Hang.
- AVID – Confirmation received on the approval of the CCI form documenting 64 areas for AVID certification this school year. AVID will also be expanding to include 6<sup>th</sup> grade next school year.
- Successful 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual PBIS Talent Show with over 200 tickets sold, and standing room only.
- 6<sup>th</sup> grade – Science Engineering projects were a success. They are looking forward to Frog Dissections.
- Successful new STEM elective offered to 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students. Will be adding a STEM elective for 6<sup>th</sup> grade students for the 2019-2020 school year.

### **MPH (continue):**

- Successful honors ELA and Math courses offered to 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students. Will be adding honors ELA and Math classes to 6<sup>th</sup> grade.
- Successful parent nights working with San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department to bring "Trends Among the Youth" information to parents, guardians and the community.
- Continued increased access to technology access. Will add 6 more chrome book carts this summer for the start of next school year to have 22 chrome book carts.

### **MHS:**

- New restrooms for staff and students
- Established a School Site Council that met once a month all year with parent and staff involvement
- Hired a new English teacher with new Study Sync curricula
- Sent the principal and one teacher to the California Continuing Education Association (CCEA) Conference and another teacher to restorative practices training
- The staff wrote their WASC self-study and coordinated a successful visit

### **RHS:**

- Introduced a graphic novel about cyberbullying into 10<sup>th</sup> grade English curricula
- Established freshman Intro to Tech class as elective using Virtual Job Shadow app for students to explore college and careers
- Principal has been doing a weekly recap for staff about the events at the school
- We have been working on a Student Wellness Center to address social/emotional student needs and Scot's Lodge to address students' basic needs like clothing, bedding, and food to be launched in the Fall
- The staff wrote their WASC self-study and earned a 6-year accreditation (until 2025)
- Students performing proficient or advanced on CAASP scores went up in both English and Math
- Introduced a new mascot, athletic gear online store, and purchased a program to put several athletic forms online
- Classes for San Bernardino Valley College will be held at RHS in the Fall for concurrent enrollment at the junior college level
