DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Administer standard assessment instruments to students referred for evaluation and assessment.
2. Observe and study students referred for assessment.
3. Evaluate assessment results and make appropriate recommendations as part of the total diagnostic assessment.
4. With the assistance of appropriate staff and parents, develop an individual education plan (IEP) to remediate disorders of language, speech and hearing.
5. Provide remedial services for children handicapped by impairments of language, speech and hearing through scheduled individual or small group therapy.
6. Serves as a resource person to school personnel, parents and community agencies as required and/or appropriate.
7. Provide ongoing evaluation of the program and children enrolled and make necessary modifications to improve services.
8. Assist with school and district staff development activities as appropriate to the areas of language, speech and hearing.
